Introducing Bank Hall Farm

Bank Hall Farm is also suitable for individuals with communication difficulties or behaviours that challenge, and predominately have dual diagnosis, as well as a range of other disabilities such as epilepsy or learning difficulties.

The service offers 24/7 specialist residential support and is committed to providing just enough support to empower and encourage individuals to develop their self-esteem and the skills they need to live as independently as possible to accomplish their goals and achieve positive outcomes for all.

The service is also supported by a team of specialist autism advisors who, through Priory Adult Care's Autism Strategy, empower service users to take control of their lives, and where possible, work towards a level of independence which fits with their skills, confidence and aspirations. Alongside this, we offer person-centred support and encourage individual's to personalise their rooms to make them feel homely, and suit their needs and requirements.

Living at Bank Hall Farm

- 7 bedrooms, all with en-suite facilities can be personalised to the requirements of each individual including furniture, soft furnishings, bedding, window dressing and paint/wall coverings
- Robust, low-arousal accommodation
- Large, safe, enclosed grounds with a trampoline and garden activities equipment
- On-site transport to access the wider community
- A convenient location, 5 minutes' from the centre, and close to local shops and amenities
- Close links with local learning disability and autism networks

Bank Hall Farm is currently developing a sensory garden which will allow individuals to explore their senses in a safe and stimulating environment.

Our services

- Specialist support for up to 7 people with autism who may also have behaviours that challenge
- Innovative person-centred support programmes including input from positive behavioural support (PBS) practitioners
- PROACT-SCIPr-UK training for all care and support workers
- Progression through a care and support pathway which aims to fulfil each individual's maximum potential and live with the greatest level of independence
- Individual's views can be communicated via Priory's 'Your Voice' service user communication programme


Referrals and placement enquiries
