


Cherrywood House

Introducing Cherrywood House

At Cherrywood House, we encourage residents to take control and have belief in their potential. We also strive to make positive outcomes a reality for everyone, regardless of their age or presumed ability.

Our dedicated and passionate staff team at Cherrywood House are required to complete the Care Certificate. In addition to this, our team also undertake mandatory training, including health and safety, first aid and PROACT-SCIPr UK, which is regularly updated as required.

Cherrywood House has external partnerships with a number of experts, including:

- An intensive support team
- Positive behaviour support (PBS) practitioner
- Psychiatrist
- Occupational therapist
- Speech and language therapist

Living at Cherrywood House

Living at Cherrywood House is a real home-from-home experience. We provide a safe and supportive environment for the individuals that live here and enable them to make the next step towards a more independent life. We actively encourage residents to develop friendships and become housemates, as we believe it is important that everyone in our care feels welcome and secure.

Our facilities include:

- 10 bedrooms
- 3 self-contained flats providing a pathway to supported living
- An art room
- 2 large day rooms where people like to relax, listen to music or watch television
- A dining room
- A large garden
- Access to a private park

Here at Cherrywood House, we are proactive in keeping the necessary people informed about an individual's care and progress. We regularly update families, authorities and governing bodies by email and telephone.

Independence skills

We are committed to providing sufficient support for residents to lead as much of an independent life as is possible for them. We are a residential home for adults with learning disabilities and additional needs, and provide support for individuals to develop their life skills and help them lead an independent life.

We support those in our care to develop daily living skills such as:

- Budgeting
- Cooking
- Personal hygiene
- Access to the wider community
- Work and education placements

Staff work closely with residents to provide the support required to gain access to employment and voluntary work opportunities. We have good links with Weston College, which provides residents with access to education and training opportunities.

Leisure activities

Cherrywood House is located on the outskirts of Weston-super-Mare, meaning it is within easy reach of the town's wide variety of leisure facilities. Residents are able to take a short bus ride into the town centre where they can find:

- A theatre
- Museums
- Cinemas
- Restaurants
- Cafés
- Shops

Many residents at Cherrywood House enjoy taking a walk in the nearby woods, which leads to the beach. There is also easy access to the town's railway station which has trains to Bristol, as well as other nearby places including Burnham-on-Sea, Taunton and Devon.

Placements criteria

At Priory Adult Care, we can offer advice about accessing benefits and funding if appropriate.

We support people on how best to spend an individual budget to make sure the people we support can live the life they want.

Referrals can be made through:

- The individual's social services department management team or, if relevant, their local health authority
- By the individual (or an appropriate adult acting on their behalf), who wishes to use individual budget or who is self-financing.
