Introducing Daisy Vale House

Daisy Vale House is a 16 bedded residential service for male and female adults in Thorpe, Wakefield which specialises in supporting people with mild learning disabilities.

Located in the heart of the village of Thorpe, the home is close to local amenities, parks and the countryside, yet in easy reach to major bus routes and the M1 and M42 motorways, making it accessible to towns and cities such as Wakefield, Morley and Leeds.

Formally a Methodist chapel, Daisy Vale House offers a warm and homely environment, as well as a friendly atmosphere.

All of the rooms throughout the house are tastefully decorated and the spacious bedrooms are personalised to each individual preference.

Daisy Vale House is part of Priory Adult Care's specialist services, which has been developed since September 1993 with the involvement of service users, families and care professionals to design best practice in supporting individuals with learning disabilities.

Our philosophy is to respect and encourage people with a learning disability to lead individualised lifestyles.

Our services

The specialist support provided at Daisy Vale House includes:

- 16 spacious bedrooms
- A comfortable and homely communal lounge, modern kitchen, dining area and a large garden
- Access to independent nutritional support, positive behaviour support and learning disability advisors
- Person-centred support programmes in a safe and caring environment
- Access to education and voluntary/paid employment opportunities
- Progression through a care pathway that fulfils each individual's maximum potential to live more independently
- Interaction within Priory Adult Care's communication strategy 'Your Voice'
- A company vehicle to access wider community facilities

The service also has an experienced and competent team to provide 24 hour care and support for our residents.



Admissions and referrals

At Priory Adult Care, we can offer advice about accessing benefits and funding if appropriate.

We support people on how best to spend an individual budget or direct payment to make sure the people we support can live the life they want.

Referrals can be made through:

- The individual's Social Services Department management team or, if relevant, their local health authority
- By the individual (or an appropriate adult acting on their behalf) who wishes to use direct payment, individual budget, or who is self-financing.

Leisure activities

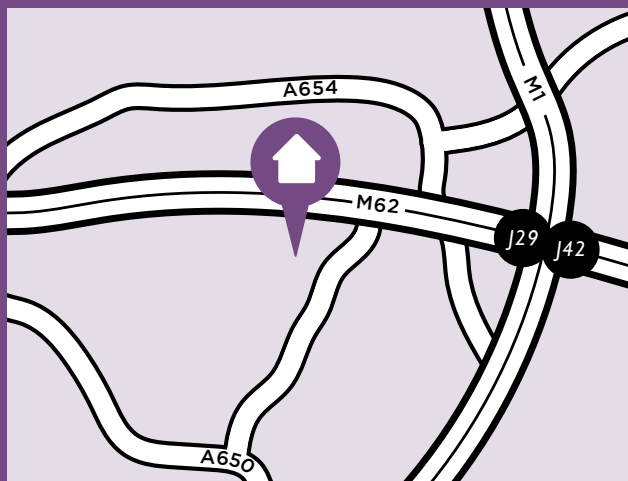

Our residents also help with the day-to-day running of the house, this includes cleaning, cooking, menu planning and food shopping.
