Introducing Wigginton Cottage

Wigginton Cottage is an eight bedded residential service for male and female adults in Tamworth, Staffordshire, which specialises in supporting people with Prader-Willi Syndrome (PWS).

Located in the heart of the beautiful village of Wigginton, the cottage is close to local amenities, parks and the countryside, yet in easy reach of major bus routes and the M6 and M42 motorways, making it accessible to towns and cities such as Birmingham, Coventry and Walsall.

Wigginton Cottage is part of Priory Adult Care's specialist Prader-Willi Syndrome services, which has been developed with the involvement of the people we support, families and care professionals, to design best practice in supporting individuals with PWS. Our philosophy is to respect and encourage people with PWS to lead individualised lifestyles.

Living with Prader-Willi Syndrome

Prader-Willi Syndrome (PWS) is a rare genetic condition that causes a wide range of symptoms. Some of the common symptoms include:

- A constant desire to eat food
- Speech and language difficulties
- Reduced muscle tone
- High pain threshold
- Learning difficulties
- Lack of secondary sexual development
- Behaviours that challenge

There is no cure for PWS, so the support provided at Wigginton Cottage aims to manage the symptoms and associated problems. Individuals with PWS who manage to follow a healthy eating plan with the right support can keep their weight down, enjoy a good quality of life and take part in activities such as voluntary or part-time work.

Our services

The specialist support provided at Wigginton Cottage includes:

- 8 en-suite bedrooms
- A spacious garden, a comfortable and homely communal lounge, modern kitchen and dining area
- Access to independent nutritional support
- Access to positive behaviour support and Learning Disability Advisors
- Person-centred support programmes in a safe and caring environment
- 1:1 psychological support, if required
- Access to education and voluntary/paid employment opportunities
- Progression through a care pathway that fulfils each individual's maximum potential to live more independently
- A multidisciplinary staff team which includes an Activity Coordinator
- Interaction within Priory Adult Care's communication strategy 'Your Voice'
- A company vehicle to access wider community facilities.


Admissions and referrals
